A dynamic exhibition of new work by emerging contemporary Ugandan artists as well as talented child-artists discovered through free children's workshops conducted by the artists opens at the Arnheim Gallery, Mass. College of Art and Design October 10. Works by Mathias Tusiime, Hassan Mukiibi, Kizito Fred Kakinda, Yusuf Ssali and others will be shown as well as over two dozen works by children. The exhibition runs through Oct. 27. Members of the Consortium have won national art competitions in Uganda and have exhibited in Europe, Africa and the U.S.
